

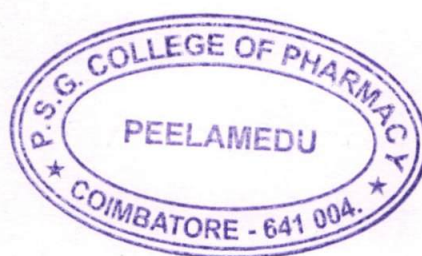

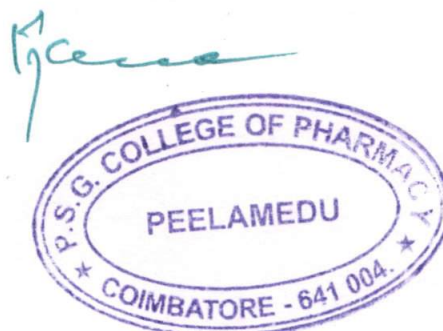

Vision

To have effective transparent functioning of the examination & evaluation process, identification of the poor performer, and support for improvisation in graduate outcomes.

Objectives

1. To facilitate, observe and audit the systematic conduct of CA, IA and End Semester examinations.
2. Identification of weak students and initiate steps for improvisation.
3. To bring in transparency in evaluation process and display of marks.
4. Conduct of result analysis and scrutiny by periodical audit.
5. Communication of academic performance of students to their parents.
6. Action for the grievances in exam related issues.



ENTRY LEVEL ASSESSMENT

Objective:

To identify the student's potential in the beginning of the year and group the students as advanced learners, moderate learners and slow learners for each subject in order to concentrate on the slow and moderate learners.

A fundamental test to check their level of understanding will be conducted.

- a. The evaluation will be done for 50 marks.
- b. Every year this assessment will be carried out at the first week of the academic calendar.
- c. The students will be categorized based on the evaluation as follows:
 - i. > 70% - Advanced Learners
 - ii. 50 – 70% - Moderate Learners
 - iii. 30 – 50% - Slow Learners
 - iv. < 30 % - Weak students

Question Preparation: 50% of the questions should be easy and answerable by all. 30% should be difficult and 20% should be very difficult questions.

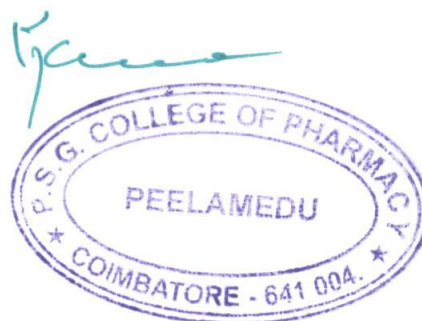
CONTINUOUS ASSESSMENT

Objectives:

- To monitor the learning of the student

Procedure:

Class coordinators are appointed by the Principal at the commencement of the academic year. They discuss with the subjects in-charge and decide the dates for conducting two CA tests before each sessional exam. This data is duly signed by all the teachers and Principal. Copy will be handed over to the subject in-charges and displayed on the class notice board. In any case there will not be any deviation from the specified dates, unless otherwise there is a sudden announcement of a public holiday.

1. CA to be conducted in the allotted test hours as scheduled in Time Table 2017 – 2018.
2. The Dates of CA will be displayed in the class notice board by class co-ordinators.

(i) Open book test – (OBT)

Questions each two marks or one word.

Questions involving concept, merits, demerits, specific reactions etc.

students can refer their own books and answer the questions.

Test on newer topics and recent advancement related to syllabus can also be conducted.

(ii) Surprise Test – (ST)

Number of questions to be asked can be chosen by the teacher

This will not be announced to the students before.

A general information (ST) can be intimated but the topics in which test is to be conducted will not be informed.

Preferably on the topics conducted recently can be asked to understand the teaching/learning process.

(iii) Class test – (CT)

The topic of the test has to be announced at least one week before

Type of question can be essay or short notes

Question each 2.5, 5 marks or 1 mark question can be asked.

(iv) Presentation – (PT)

Topics purely from subjects allotted by the class co-ordinator

Time of presentation shall be minimum of 5 mins and maximum of 7 min with 2 min question session.

(v) Out of Syllabus Work – (OSW)

The objective is to focus on the creativity and logical thinking of the student

It can be a case study/problem solving and topic related to Pharmacy or science

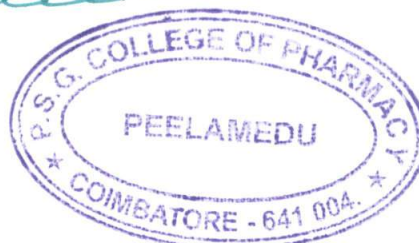
It can be a individual or group work

The source of information will be the internet, journal or reference books.

(vi) Assignment – (A)

Topics purely from subjects

- IA theory to be uploaded – 30 marks
- Division of IA (15 marks from CA, 15 marks from IA)
- CA – aggregate of 15 marks to be calculated.
- IA – 35 marks question paper to be set. Template will be provided. From this, calculate for 15 marks

$$\text{CA} + \text{IA} = 15 + 15 = 30 \text{ marks}$$

$$\text{CA} + \text{IA} = 15 + 15 = 30 \text{ marks}$$

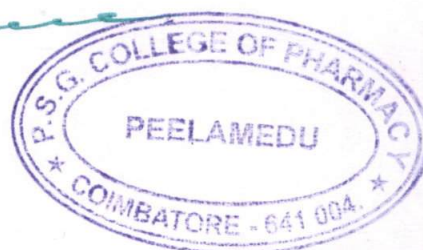
