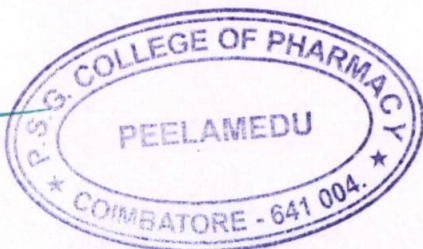



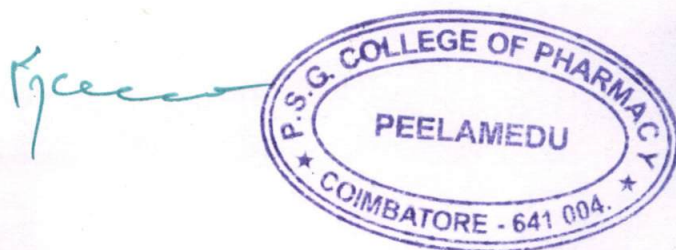
Orientation Programme - (2015-2016)

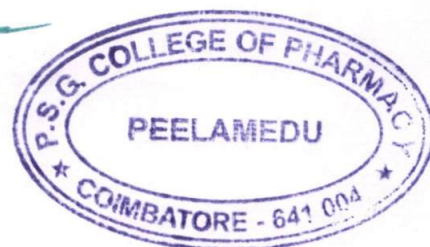
Orientation Programme Report - (2019-2020)
