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I am to inform you that the meeting of the Board of Studies in Pharmacy  
Courses held on 09.09.2016 had discussed various academic matters. The  
recommendations of the Board of Studies in Pharmacy as approved by the 52<sup>nd</sup>  
meeting of the Standing Academic Board held on 29.09.2016 and recorded in the  
248<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Governing Council held on 08.11.2016 are forwarded for  
implementation.

**I. THE CLARIFICATIONS RECEIVED FROM THE PHARMACY  
COUNCIL OF INDIA, NEW DELHI IN RESPECT OF PHARMACY  
DEGREE COURSES.**

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It was resolved to permit the use of Non Scientific calculator at practical examinations and for the following theory examinations in Bio-statistics, Bio Pharmaceutics, Pharmacology of B.Pharm and Remedial Maths of Pharm.D & all M.Pharm examinations as per PCI norms.

As per Regulation 15 of Pharm.D Regulation 2008, regarding eligibility for promotion to next year, "The students who have appeared for all the subjects and passed the first year annual examination are eligible for promotion to the second year and, so on. However failure in more than two subjects shall debar him or her from promotion to the next year classes".

It was resolved to continue the regulation as per the above said existing PCI norms.

It was resolved to accept the PCI norms of not fixing any maximum duration for the courses B.Pharm, M.Pharm, Pharm. D and Pharm. D (Post Baccalaureate).

It was resolved that the New PCI syllabus for B.Pharmacy course which is to be implemented already included a subject on environmental studies. The New syllabus will be implemented from the academic year 2017 - 2018 onwards.

**II. THE REVISED REGULATIONS 2014 AND THE DRAFT SYLLABUS FOR B.PHARM AND M.PHARM DEGREE COURSES PRESCRIBED BY THE PHARMACY COUNCIL OF INDIA, NEW DELHI INCLUDING SEMESTER PATTERN OF EXAMINATION AND INTERNAL ASSESSMENT FOR IMPLEMENTATION BY THIS UNIVERSITY.**

**It was resolved that -**

**a) Date of implementation :**

The PCI syllabus for B.Pharm and M.Pharm is to be implemented from 2016 -17. However, the M.Pharm Course has already been commenced and the B.Pharmacy admission is yet to be completed. In view of this, it was resolved to implement the new PCI syllabus and regulations from the academic year 2017 -18 onwards.

**b) Content of Syllabus:**

The consolidated report compiled by the Chairman regarding the desired changes in content of the syllabus has been sent to the PCI for further decision.

**c) Examination Pattern:**

Considering the logistics involved in administering the MCQ pattern, it was resolved to have 10 short questions of 2 marks each instead of MCQs and to write to PCI for consideration.

**d) Arrear examination :**

It was resolved to seek clarification with PCI as to whether the odd semester arrear examination be taken up on odd semesters only (Similarly for even semesters) or can the arrear subjects be taken at any semester.

**III. TO RATIFY THE ACTION OF THIS UNIVERSITY FOR HAVING CONDUCTED THE APRIL 2016 SESSION EXAMINATIONS PHARM.D AND PHARM.D (POST BACCALAUREATE) DEGREE COURSES ACCORDING TO THE EXISTING MARKS DISTRIBUTION OF ORAL / PRACTICAL MARKS AND TO IMPLEMENT THE MODIFIED MARK DISTRIBUTION FROM APRIL 2017 ONWARDS.**

It was resolved to ratify the action of this university for having conducted the April 2016 session examinations for Pharm.D and Pharm.D (Post Baccalaureate) degree courses according to the existing marks distribution of oral / practical marks and to implement the modified mark distribution from October 2016 examination session onwards.

**IV. TO RATIFY THE ACTION OF THIS UNIVERSITY FOR HAVING CONDUCTED THE APRIL – 2016 SESSION EXAMINATIONS M.PHARM DEGREE COURSE ACCORDING TO THE EXISTING MARKS DISTRIBUTION OF ORAL / PRACTICAL MARKS AND TO IMPLEMENT THE MODIFIED MARK DISTRIBUTION FROM APRIL-2017 ONWARDS.**

It was resolved to ratify the action of this University for having implemented the existing marks distribution of oral / practical marks and to implement the modified marks distribution from April 2017 examination session onwards.

**V. ADMISSION OF CANDIDATES TO EXAMINATIONS BASED ON THE ATTENDANCE PROGRESS.**

It was resolved to approve the following modifications and to incorporate the same in the existing B.Pharm. Regulations:

A candidate lacking in the prescribed attendance and progress in theory and practical examination shall not be permitted for the respective subject alone. The candidate can be allowed to appear for the remaining subjects if he is fulfilling all the conditions as per regulations.

**VI. REMOVAL OF BREAK SYSTEM BASED ON P.C.I REGULATIONS.**

1. In view of the proposed implementation of the new syllabus of the PCI from the academic year 2017 -18, it was resolved to remove all break systems and permit the students to take up the examinations irrespective of arrear papers from February 2017 examination session onwards.

2. It was further resolved that the conduct of examinations to Pharm.D candidates in the month of August 2017 will be considered based on the feasibility of a draft schedule for Pharm.D examinations.

**VII. THE CLARIFICATIONS RECEIVED FROM THE PHARMACY COUNCIL OF INDIA, NEW DELHI, FOR STARTING NEW BACHELOR OF PHARMACY (PRACTICE) TWO YEARS DEGREE COURSE.**

It was resolved to permit the course with the following stipulations :

The prospectus should clearly state on the cover page in bold in boxes the following statements.

- a. The graduates of B.Pharm (Practice ) course are not eligible for admission to any other Pharmacy Postgraduate degree courses.
- b. The B.Pharm (Practice) course is not eligible for the purpose of recruitment wherever the four year B.Pharmacy course is the eligible criteria.

**VIII. INCLUSION OF NSS AS AN ELECTIVE SUBJECT IN THE CURRICULUM OF MEDICAL, DENTAL, NURSING, PHARMACY, INDIAN MEDICINE, HOMOEOPATHY AND ALLIED HEALTH SCIENCE COURSES.**

It was resolved to write to the PCI, New Delhi to include NSS as an elective subject in the UG B.Pharmacy curriculum.
