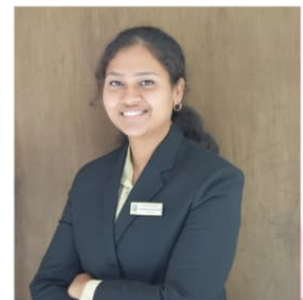

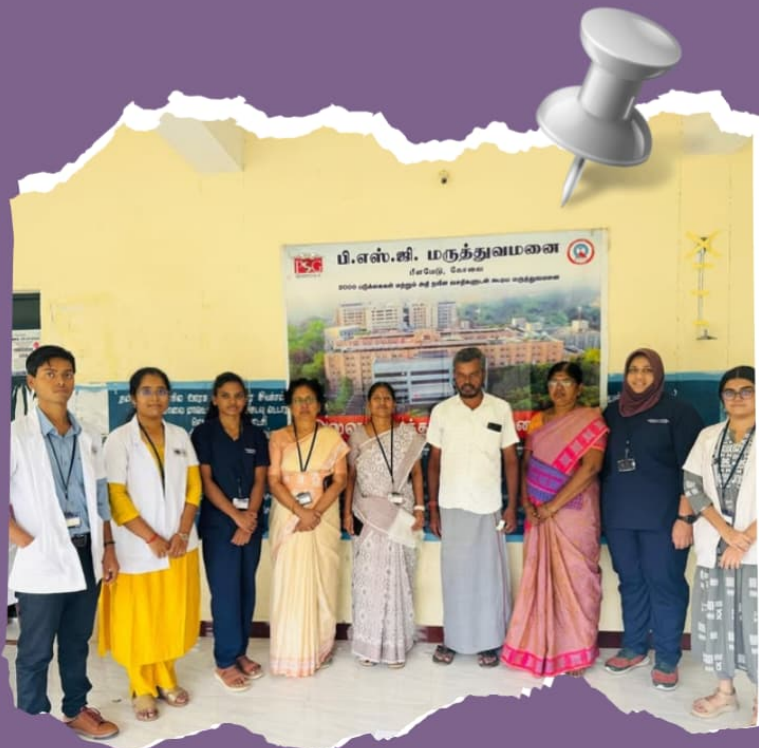

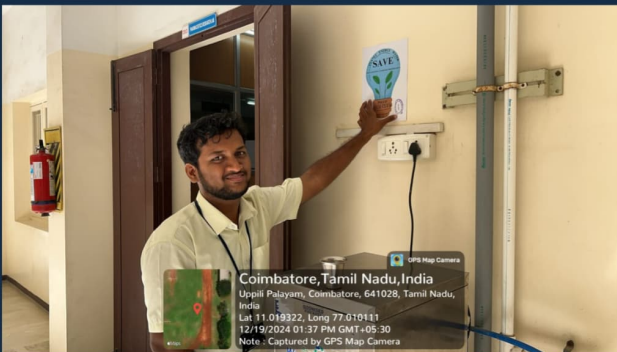


WORLD ENERGY CONSERVATION DAY

SUMMER RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP

During the Summer Research Fellowship Programme-2024, which lasted from June 10 to August 5, a total of 57 days, I had the opportunity to work on the project titled “Understanding the cell fate decision-making of cancerous cells under the simultaneous influence of varied pressure and hypoxic conditions.” This was conducted under the guidance of Prof. Sandip Kar at the Systems Biology Lab, IIT Bombay, Powai, Mumbai. The project aimed to investigate how different cancer cell lines respond when exposed to a range of pressure and oxygen conditions. While the individual roles of pressure and hypoxia in tumor biology have been studied separately, there has been little research exploring their combined effects on cell fate decision-making in cancerous cells. To carry out this study, we utilized a novel incubator instrument capable of creating varied pressure and hypoxic environments. Throughout the fellowship, I observed the behavior of various cancer cell lines, including A549 (lung cancer) and T-47D (breast cancer), under these conditions. I gained hands-on experience in several laboratory techniques such as subculturing cancer cell lines, PCR, Incucyte imaging, aseptic transfer, sterile filtration, liquid handling, pipetting, dispensing, and centrifugation. Additionally, I was introduced to advanced concepts like FUCCI and computational tools such as XPPAUT. This fellowship provided me with valuable insights into cancer biology and research methodologies, and it deepened my understanding of the diverse techniques used in scientific investigations. Overall, it was a highly enriching experience that broadened my knowledge and sparked a greater interest in research.

I would recommend that if any means you have any chances to Attending fellowship, give it a try, because there are always few things to learn in this world. By attending this fellowship i get to few things about how AI works in ongoing health care research, along with computational works, also I've got many connections to professors and PhD scholars.

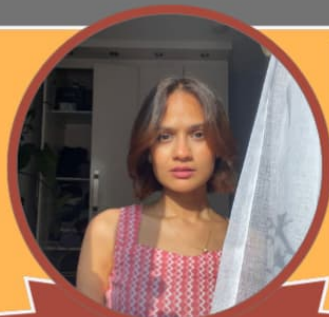

working on a project titled “Association of Lactase Persistence with
Statin-induced Diabetes in Coronary Artery Disease Patients of
South India.” Under the mentorship of Dr. A. K. Munirajan and Dr.
Bharath Govindaswamy, I gained hands-on expertise in molecular
biology techniques, including nucleic acid isolation, Nanodrop
spectrophotometry, gel electrophoresis, and PCR. This
transformative experience significantly enriched my understanding
of pharmacogenetics, research methods, and personalized medicine.

I'm honoured to share my career journey with the budding pharmacists at PSG COP. I would like to thank the magazine editors for this opportunity. My name is Eldhose Jose, and I'm a 2013-19 PharmD graduate. After completing my PharmD, I joined PSG Hospitals as a senior pharmacist. It was a great experience, as I was able to apply my theoretical knowledge to practice. I also got the chance to be part of the NABH internal QC team and assist the pharmacy manager in the drugs and therapeutics meeting. This role helped me hone my critical thinking and decision-making skills.

I later transitioned into clinical research, working as an external clinical scientific expert at Novartis, Hyderabad. This opportunity came through a referral from one of our alumni, Mr. Jithin Titus. I recommend maintaining good connections with alumni, as referred CVs generally have a better chance of landing an interview.

I work as a foundation year pharmacist at The Queen Elizabeth NHS Hospital in King's Lynn, United Kingdom. In the UK, internally trained pharmacists must complete a nine-month Overseas Pharmacists Assessment Program (OSPAP) followed by a one-year paid internship in a hospital, community pharmacy, or pharmaceutical industry to be eligible for the pharmacist registration exam. This program is offered by four universities: the University of Brighton, the University of Sunderland, the University of Herfordshire, and Aston University. Additional details about the OSPAP course can be found on the GPhC website: [GPhC OSPAP Information](#). There is also a proposal to combine the OSPAP and foundation year into a single year, which, if approved, will be implemented in 2026.

The UK offers numerous career progression opportunities for pharmacists. The recently launched Pharmacy First program allows pharmacists to diagnose and treat seven common conditions within the community pharmacy setting. Additionally, starting in 2025, MPharm graduates will graduate as independent prescribers, able to prescribe most medications within their competence. Registered pharmacists can also take an independent prescribing course to become independent prescribers (IPs). There are also opportunities to progress into consultant roles, such as pain consultants, and even run clinics in hospitals.

Lastly, I want to highlight the great library facilities at PSG COP, especially the online resources like Medicines Complete and UpToDate. These resources are the main reference tools used here in the UK, and my prior experience using them helped me get accustomed to the OSPAP course and foundation year.

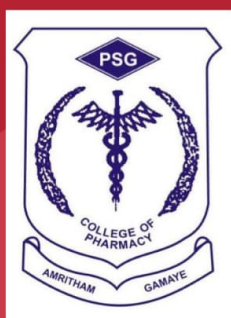
